## 1. Purpose

#### Aims

The aim of this service is to offer improved access to Emergency Hormonal Contraception (EHC) for young people (13 - 24 years age group) through a network of pharmacists within Swindon.

It is essential that we continue to engage with this age group to support a sustainable reduction in the number of teenage conceptions and abortions - the pharmacies will help to support this work by providing this service to support the reduction of teenage pregnancies and inform good sexual health within the Swindon area.

#### Evidence base

In line with the national rates, teenage pregnancies within Swindon have been falling, with rates now lower than the England average and most of Swindon's closest statistical (CIPFA) neighbours. Although the number of teenage pregnancies is low this needs to be maintained and inequalities still exist across the Swindon geography, with higher numbers in some of the most deprived wards.

Improving sexual health is a key national and local priority for Swindon. Work has been successfully undertaken over recent years to address these health inequalities and pharmacies have been a key partner in this achievement. This SLA demonstrates a partnership responsibility (Swindon Borough Council and Great Western Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust) to continue making significant inroads into improving sexual health outcomes for Service Users in Swindon.

## General Overview

This agreement sets out the framework for the provision of an enhanced service for Community Pharmacies to register and issue Emergency Hormone Contraception (EHC) under a Patient Group Directive (PGD).

This framework has been agreed with the Swindon and Wiltshire Local Pharmaceutical Committee (LPC). The implementation, administration, monitoring and review of this agreement is the responsibility of Great Western Hospital Foundation Trust, as commissioned by Swindon Borough Council.

This agreement includes the expectation to promote and signpost service users to undertake a Chlamydia testing. This expectation, whilst not mandatory (i.e., contraception must not be withheld if the service user refuses to undertake a Chlamydia test) should be strongly encouraged.

The decision to include this is based on recent evidence of Chlamydia prevalence amongst those who request EHC (20% positivity of those who tested in other areas across the South West region).

## Objectives

The aim and objectives of this service are to:

- Increase swift access to EHC by females up to 25years of age who have had unprotected sex
- Create an opportunity for Chlamydia testing by signposting to relevant services
- Improve the service user's knowledge, demand, and uptake for LARC (Long lasting Reversible Contraception)
- To support better sexual health outcomes for young people aged under 25 who live in Swindon through signposting to free online Condom delivery service
- To hold and supply short term stock of Condoms at point of consultation (when online service permits).

- To raise the general populations awareness of STI's, particularly Chlamydia and Gonorrhoea, and the role of condoms in reducing the risk
- To increase the uptake of Chlamydia testing amongst the sexually active 16-24 population of Swindon, through effective signposting to the online service.

## **Expected Outcomes**

- To improve access to EHC for females between the age of 13 & 24
- To improve access to contraception and testing for Young people
- To contribute to reducing health inequalities across the local health community
- To increase patient choice by providing additional access channels to Chlamydia Screening and contraception
- To contribute to reducing the prevalence of Chlamydia in Young people under 25
- To increase the awareness of Chlamydia in young people under 25.
- To provide advice and support to improve sexual health outcomes
- Reduce teenage pregnancies and termination of pregnancies

## 2. Scope

## Service Description

The Pharmacy will provide support and advice (written and verbal) to clients accessing the service, including advice on safer sex, condom use, the avoidance of pregnancy, the use of regular contraceptive methods and provide onward signposting/referral to services that provide long-term contraceptive methods and diagnosis and management of STIs.

The Pharmacy will promote Chlamydia testing and signpost accordingly. This expectation, whilst not mandatory should be strongly encouraged (i.e., contraception must not be withheld if the service user refuses to undertake a Chlamydia test)

The Sexual Health Service (GWHFT) will ensure supplies of condoms are provided to pharmacies within 7 days of request being submitted online.

The online Chlamydia testing will be supplied to the patient via the online platform following signposting withing 7 days.

In addition, patients being signposted to the Online Condoms (C card scheme) will be supplied within 7 days and thereafter.

#### EHC:

Participating pharmacies will provide a comprehensive EHC consultation, which requires the provision of women aged between 13 - 24 years of age free at the point of delivery with:

- Levonorgestrel or Ulipristal acetate
- Information, signposting, advice, and promotion of condoms to reduce STIs; and
- Information, signposting, advice, and promotion and/or for LARC
- Patients aged under 13 are assessed as 'Fraser competent' against the Fraser Guidelines. The patient should be referred to an appropriate sexual health clinic or GP practice. Details of the patient and their situation should also be discussed with your designated safeguarding lead. EHC should not be provided in this instance.

## Accessibility / Acceptability

The service will be available during the normal opening hours of the pharmacy on premises that have a consultation room.

## 3. Service Delivery

## Service Model

Provide EHC to patients aged 13 to 24 (inclusive) presenting up to 120hrs after unprotected sexual intercourse, who are not excluded from treatment under the PGD

The Pharmacy will offer a user friendly, non-judgemental, client centred and confidential service and is expected to fulfil the standards of the 'You are Welcome' guidance (or relaunched standard) from the Department of Health. The young people may at times act as 'mystery shoppers' to assess the service provision.

Confidentiality statements clearly displayed and explained to young people

The part of the pharmacy used for provision of the service provides a sufficient level of privacy: - the Pharmacist and the service user must be able to sit comfortably together, and the conversations between the pharmacist and service user cannot be overheard by members of the public or other pharmacy staff.

The Pharmacy will work in partnership with the commissioner to ensure local campaigns and promotions are included within Pharmacy activity.

The service will be provided in compliance with Fraser guidance and Department of Health guidance on confidential sexual health advice and treatment for young people.

Ensure patients aged under 16 are assessed as 'Fraser competent' against the Fraser Guidelines. A patient deemed not to be competent should be referred to an appropriate sexual health clinic or GP practice. Details of the patient and their situation should also be discussed with your designated safeguarding lead

All under 18s should receive a risk assessment for CSE and referred to local safeguarding pathway if required. All under 16s should also be referred to the Sexual Health service via pharmoutcomes.

The service protocols should reflect National and Local Safeguarding Children and Vulnerable Adult Protection guidelines 2

The Provider shall record the consultations clinical and financial details using the agreed Pharmoutcomes Platform.

The Pharmacy must maintain appropriate records via pharmoutcomes to ensure effective ongoing service delivery and audit.

The training requirements to sign the PGD/be involved in the service should be the CPPE (Centre for postgraduate Pharmacy Education) Declaration of Competence httQs://www.CQQe.ac.uk/services/declaration-of-comQetence which is supported by nationally approved training materials and on-line assessment

#### Associated Care Pathways

If the Pharmacist has concerns that the service user may be pregnant, they should be referred to an appropriate service.

Where a supply of Levonorgestrel or Ulipristal acetate is not appropriate (based on age or Pharmacist concerns), advice and referral must be made to another local service that will be able to assist them, as soon as possible, e.g., Sexual Health Service, Sexual Health Outreach service or GP.

For young women requesting EHC service a referral for LARC, including Emergency Coil fitting, should be offered via the sexual health service.

Under 18s offered a referral to the sexual health service for on-going contraception follow-up

If the Pharmacist is unable to supply contraception because they do not have any supplies in stock, they should ensure that the client is directed to an alternative pharmacy or other appropriate service and GWHFT is notified.

If the Pharmacist is unable to supply contraception because they are not accredited/signed up to PGD at the time of consultation, the client is directed to an alternative pharmacy or other appropriate services and GWHFT is notified

Pharmacists will need to share relevant information with other health care professionals and agencies, in line with locally determined confidentiality arrangements, including, where appropriate, the need for the permission of the client to share the information. The service user should be advised that this is not a breach of confidentiality at the beginning of the consultation.

Where a young person requests more comprehensive sexual health support the Pharmacy will refer into Outreach Nursing and / or a Pharmacy able to provide Emergency hormonal contraception. Where a referral is made to Outreach, pharmacies will use the secure email platform, such as PharmOutcomes which generates secure message to nhs.mail recipients. or nhs.net to nhs.net email communication.

Any under 18s, or vulnerable adult, showing safeguarding flags should be referred through local safeguarding pathways

#### 4. Access and Acceptance Criteria

#### Geographic coverage/boundaries

Females aged between 13 and 24 years inclusive; resident, working in or visiting Swindon are eligible for EHC service.

## Days/hours of operation

The service will operate in line with the normal opening hours of the Pharmacy. Outside of these times, service users can contact the Sexual Health Service or alternative NHS services.

#### Self - Referral Eligibility

• Aged between 13 & 24 years for EHC

If the young person is not eligible, the Pharmacy will direct the young person to alternative services using associated care pathways described within this SLA.

The pharmacy contractor co-operates with any locally agreed GWHFT led assessment of service user experience

## 6. Purchaser responsibilities

The GWHFT Sexual Health Service (the commissioner) will conduct an evaluation of the service to ensure value for money and outcomes.

The GWHFT Sexual Health Service (the commissioner) will compile and share quarterly reports on pharmacy activity

The GWHFT Sexual Health Service (the commissioner) may choose to undertake "mystery shopping" of the service by young people to establish service user experience and feedback from this will be shared with the pharmacy and LPC.

GWHFT may arrange contractor meetings to promote service development and update pharmacy staff with new developments, knowledge, and evidence.

GWHFT will provide up to date details of other services, which Pharmacy staff can use to refer service users who require further assistance. The information should include the location, hours of opening and services provided by each service provider.

GWHFT will be responsible for the promotion of the service locally, including the development of publicity materials, which pharmacies can use to promote the service to the public.

GWHFT will be responsible for the provision of health promotion material, relevant to the service users and make this available to the Pharmacies by contacting the Sexual Health service in Swindon.
